



CMMC COMPLIANCE

What It Means for Federal Contractors

Overview

The Department of Defense issued the final rule for DFARS 252.204-7021 on September 10, 2025. Beginning November 10, 2025, program offices can include Cybersecurity Maturity Model Certification (CMMC) in new solicitations. In three years, CMMC will be mandatory for nearly all contracts that involve Federal Contract Information (FCI) or Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI). This applies not only to prime contractors handling sensitive data directly, but also to vendors and service providers whose work involves FCI and CUI—such as manufacturers, professional services, IT and engineering support, and facility services. Contractors should act now to prepare, compete, and stay eligible.

What's Happening Now

The final rule was published in the *Federal Register* on September 10, 2025, and takes effect November 10, 2025.

From that date forward, program offices may choose to include CMMC requirements in solicitations. In three years, CMMC requirements will be mandatory for nearly all contracts that involve Federal Contract Information (FCI) or Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI), with the exception of contracts exclusively for commercially available off-the-shelf (COTS) items.

CMMC builds on existing compliance requirements, including:

- ✓ DFARS 7012 (NIST 800-171)
- ✓ SPRS scoring
- ✓ Annual affirmations of continuous compliance by an "affirming official"

What Will Be Required

Certification or Self-Assessment at Award

Depending on the contract, you'll need to either complete a self-assessment (Level 1 or Level 2 Self) or pass a third-party assessment (Level 2 C3PAO or Level 3 DIBAC) before award. Certification must be current, issued within the past three years, and at the level specified in the solicitation.

Conditional Status and POA&Ms

For Levels 2 and 3, DoD allows a conditional certification for up to 180 days if tied to an approved Plan of Action and Milestones (POA&M). Final certification is achieved only once all POA&M items are closed.

Supply Chain Flow-down

Flow-down applies when subcontractors process, store, or transmit FCI or CUI. Subcontractors must also upload self-assessments and affirmations of compliance in SPRS.

SPRS Registration

Your assessment must be uploaded and validated in the Supplier Performance Risk System (SPRS).

Lifecycle Management

CMMC requires continuous compliance. You'll need to affirm compliance every year, revalidate after system changes, and complete a new assessment every three years to maintain eligibility. Contracting officers must also verify CMMC status before exercising options or extending a period of performance.
